V.	Do you think Jesus provides hope today in our current lives? How or why not?
VI.	In the preface, Wright writes of his limited experience with death even as a pastor/ theologian and as a person in his 50s. What has been your experience with death? Have you felt close to death previously? Have you lost family or friends or others under difficult circumstances?
VII.	Our scriptures describe Jesus as King. Do you think our faith should speak in to our politics? Why or why not? How or how not?
