CALL TO WORSHIP (from Psalm 104)

One: Bless the Lord, O my soul.

All: O Lord my God, you are very great.
One: You are clothed with honor and majesty,
All: wrapped in light as with a garment.
You stretch out the heavens like a tent.

All: you set the beams of your chambers on the waters,

One: you make the clouds your chariot,

All: you ride on the wings of the wind,

One: you make the winds your messengers.

All: fire and flame your ministers.
One: You set the earth on its foundations,
all: so that it will never be shaken.

One: You cover it with the deep as with a garment; the waters stood above the mountains.

One: O Lord, how manifold are your works! In wisdom you have made them all;

All: the earth is full of your creatures. Praise the Lord!

*Call to Confession (from Hebrews 5)
