CALL TO WORSHIP (from Psalm 19)

One: The heavens are telling the glory of God;

All: and the firmament proclaims his handiwork.
One: The law of the Lord is perfect, reviving the soul;

All: the decrees of the Lord are sure, making wise the simple.

One: The precepts of the Lord are right, rejoicing the heart;

All: the commandment of the Lord is clear, enlightening the eyes;

One: the fear of the Lord is pure, enduring forever;

All: the ordinances of the Lord are true and righteous altogether.
One: More to be desired are they than gold, sweeter also than honey.

CALL TO CONFESSION

Assurance of Pardon (from Mark 8)

Jesus offers salvation to those who follow him — those who deny themselves and take up their cross. Lose your life for Jesus and receive his salvation and forgiveness. **Amen.**

PRAYER OF DEDICATION (from Mark 8)

Gracious God, despite that we failed to follow your ways, you came in human form as the Son of Man, who underwent great suffering, was rejected by the elders and other religious leaders, and was killed but to rise again after three days. In thankfulness, we offer these gifts that your name and your works might be known throughout the earth. Amen.
